- ✓ Check to see if your schools would like to host a Save Our Shorelines (see poster) to have a conservation officer in to visit classrooms.
- ✓ Memberships must be in by May 15/19 to receive the next issue of Outdoor Canada West.
- ✓ Branches that have signed up for Directors & Officers Insurance will be billed for the renewal in May (May 2019 - May 2020). This is an optional insurance, but should be seriously considered. We have had 2 branches with ranges where one had the insurance and one did not, and there were noise issues with the surrounding neighbours. The branch without was responsible for all lawyer costs, whereas the other branch was covered under this insurance.
