# OFFICIAL TAX DEDUCTIBLE RECEIPT

The Saskatchewan Wildlife Federation is a Charitable Organization and therefore is able to issue official income tax deductible receipts for donations given to our branches up to the dollar amount donated to the SWF within our fiscal year Nov 1 to Oct 31. For example, if a branch donated \$5,000 to the Hannin Creek facility at our convention, and received generous donations towards their own fundraising event, they could send us a list of those donations and we could provide receipts to the branch up to \$5,000.

Please note the following:

- Requests for official receipts must be in to Central Office prior to our year end, and can include donations to the SWF during our fiscal year of Nov 1 to Oct 31. The donations received by the branch, for which the SWF would write receipts, must also fall within the SWF's fiscal year dates, i.e. if your fundraiser is in April, you need to have the request for receipts into Central Office prior to October 31, not by the year end of December 31.
- Names and full addresses are required for all official receipts.
- Businesses do not always require an official receipt...if they receive a regular receipt they may be able to write the whole amount off for advertising, whereas the official receipt would only allow a certain percentage to be written off – check with the businesses to make sure what type of receipt works best for them. The branch can issue their own “regular” receipts.
- Official receipts are to be issued for “donations” only. You cannot receive an official receipt if you receive something in return, i.e. if you buy an item at an auction, a regular receipt can be issued, but not an official receipt. If someone “sponsors” an item for your auction, i.e. pays your branch for the cost of that item or the value you have asked as sponsorship, they can receive an official receipt. If they donate an item, the value it received on auction becomes the fair market value, and that is the amount they would receive the receipt for, unless they give you something that proves that value is more than what it got on auction.
- A charity **CANNOT** issue a receipt for a gift of service. At law, a gift is a voluntary transfer of property without consideration. Contributions of services are not property and therefore do not qualify as gifts for the purpose of issuing official donation receipts. If a charity pays a service provider for services and the service provider then chooses to donate the money back, the charity can issue a receipt for the monetary donation (this is often referred to as a cheque exchange). In such circumstances, these two distinct transactions **MUST** take place:
  - \* A person provides a service to a charity and is paid for that service
  - \* That same person makes a voluntary gift of property to the charity.

For example: A receipt **cannot** be issued for someone installing a furnace at your wildlife building, however, if after being paid, the installer donates the money back, then they can receive an official receipt.

A copy of the invoice issued by the service provider must be kept on file. The invoice and cheque exchange not only ensure that the charity is receipting a gift of property, but they also create an audit trail, as the donor must account for the taxable income that is realized. A charity should **NOT** issue an official donation receipt to a service provider in exchange for an invoice marked “paid”.

# BRANCH GUIDELINES FOR RESOLUTIONS

## SWF Resolution Criteria

Resolutions shall be classified as:

- \* **Regular** – must be drafted, passed, and recorded in the minutes of the branch meeting, and then forwarded/presented to a Regional Meeting. It must pass by a two-thirds majority vote at a Regional Meeting and be forwarded to the SWF's Central Office within 30 days of the Regional Meeting to be presented to the Annual Meeting.
- \* **Board** – special resolutions or motions may be presented to the Annual Meeting by the Board of Directors, without prior notice, provided they have the support of the Board.
- \* **Emergency** – An emergency resolution is defined as a resolution that has not been brought forward and passed at a regional meeting. The SWF Board of Directors will determine if the resolution is in fact an emergency. An emergency resolution brought to the floor must receive two-thirds majority approval for presentation. If the delegates give two-thirds majority approval, the resolution is presented the same as Regular or Board resolutions, and may be passed, lost or tabled as the delegates see fit.

**All resolutions must meet the following criteria as determined by the Resolutions Committee:**

- \* Be consistent with the SWF's goals, aims, and objectives.
- \* Be relevant to current or future SWF issues. Not be discriminatory or slanderous in nature.
- \* Not be of a purely local nature.

***Branches and/or Regions have the following options to deal with local issues (i.e. pertaining to local area/ waterbody/ particular WMZs, etc.)***

- \* Draft and pass, with a majority vote, a Motion at the branch level, forwarding it for consideration to the SWF Central Office to be dealt with in a timely manner.
- \* Draft and pass, with a majority vote, a Motion at the branch level, presenting it to the Regional Meeting, and if passed by a majority vote at the regional level, forwarding it for consideration to the SWF Central Office to be dealt with in a timely manner.
- \* Draft and pass, with a majority vote, a Motion at the regional level, and if passed, forwarding it for consideration to the SWF Central Office to be dealt with in a timely manner.

## HOW TO WRITE A RESOLUTION

1. Decide what the final result is that you want to accomplish through the resolution, i.e. the "Be it resolved" It should be clear, concise and to the point in as few words as possible. All explanation should be done in the preamble, not in the final resolution.
2. The resolution, if directed at the government or a group outside the Saskatchewan Wildlife Federation, cannot give direction for the SWF to "lobby" "Strongly urge" or other such statements are recommended.
3. Once the final direction is decided upon, the preamble ("whereas") shall be listed in order to give an explanation and reasons behind the resolution. Keep in mind that voting delegates may not be familiar with what the resolution is about, and therefore it is important that the preamble contain enough pertinent information to enable them to vote knowledgeably.
4. Each point in the preamble should be a separate "Whereas" and should also be clear, concise and to the point in as few words as possible.
5. Any facts or statistics used in the preamble must be truthful and accurate.
6. All resolutions must be consistent with the Saskatchewan Wildlife Federation's goals, aims, and objectives and be relevant to current or future SWF issues.
7. Resolutions must not be slanderous or discriminatory in any way.
